The meeting was called to order by Mayor Skinner at 6:30 p.m. and a welcome extended to Constable Trevor Molloy & Corporal Sheldon Hynes. Cpl. Hynes wanted to officially thank the Mayor & Council for their overwhelming support shown during his stay in Hr. Breton, since he will be leaving as of June 15th.

Constable Molloy informed that as of June 28, 2012, he, too, will also be leaving as well. He, too, also stated that he thoroughly enjoyed his time in Hr. Breton. Thanks extended to Council for this support in his capacity as a volunteer & an RCMP officer. Several items that he wanted to discuss in regards to the Arena Board as follows:

- 4. A FM radio system has been set up now whereby, residents without the local community channel can tune to the radio station and be able to play tv bingo;

- **6.** Another new program that he has been & will be working on, is the Molson Cheers Program, whereby you have to prepare a blurb on why the Arena Board would need the funding;
- **6.** Discussion on the issue of the 'alleged forged documents' of the Recreation Commission. Concerns still expressed as to how Council will be dealing with this issue, however, to date, there has been no official complaint. It is up to the Town to decide how to proceed from here. Recommending that moving forward, Council should have control Both officers stated that, in their opinions, if there is evidence of possible wrongdoing, then it is up to Council to act on the matter.

Constable Molloy went on to say that it is the town's duty, that if a document has been presented to Council that has been altered in some way, then it should be investigated. Both officers left at 7:35 p.m.
